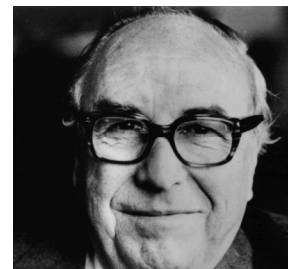

A NOTED BRITISH STATESMAN REFLECTS ON CHURCHILL

Please Join Us for Lunch with Roy Jenkins, One of Britain's Leading Public Figures, As He Talks About and Signs Copies of His New Biography of Sir Winston Churchill

In an event to be covered by C-SPAN, one of the most influential personalities in 20th-century British political life will share his insights about a Prime Minister whose courage and eloquence are both legendary and freshly pertinent. Born in 1920, Roy Jenkins entered the House of Commons in 1948 as a member of the Labour Party and soon became one of the most redoubtable figures in Parliament. In 1964 he was appointed Minister of Aviation, and from 1965 to 1967 he served a distinguished term as Home Secretary. As Chancellor of the Exchequer (1967-70) he imposed a stringent austerity plan to address his nation's financial crisis. In 1971, defying a Labour majority, he supported Britain's entrance to the European Community. A few years later he was serving as President of the European Commission. In 1981 he helped found the Liberal Democratic Party as an alternative to Conservative and Labour policies. In 1987, shortly after he was created a life peer, Lord Jenkins became Chancellor of the University of Oxford, a post he still holds. Most of us know Bill Press as the left-leaning co-host of *CROSSFIRE*, where he debates the issues of the day with such adversaries as Robert Novak and a wide spectrum of fascinating guests. But Mr. Press is also a nationally syndicated columnist, and when he's not on the air he reflects upon the broader implications of the work that he and his fellow journalists find so compelling. One result is a new book - *Spin This!* - whose title alludes to another show, *The Spin Room*, which Mr. Press co-hosted with Tucker Carlson in the aftermath of Election 2000. During a luncheon forum to be co-hosted with the Woman's National Democratic Club and The Shakespeare Guild, Mr. Press will chat about the English that politicians, PR specialists, and advertisers have been putting on our language for as long as we've had leaders like Richard III and Henry V - and observers like the Swan of Avon to record their words and deeds.
